### 2023 Hall of Honor Inductees

The following inductees will be celebrated at the Heritage Dinner on Wednesday, April 26th:

# Admiral William Moran United States Navy

Admiral Moran was born in Nyack, New York and raised in the town of Walden, just north of New York City. He graduated from the United States Naval Academy in 1981 and following initial flight training, he reported to VP-44 at NAS Brunswick, Maine, where he served as an Instructor Pilot and Pilot Training Officer and participated in Cold War deployments to Sigonella, Sicily and Rota, Spain. He subsequently served as an instructor pilot at VP-30, Flag Lieutenant in USS FORRESTAL and back again at VP-30 as senior NATOPS evaluator.

Following a tour in Washington DC, he reported to VP-46, serving as Executive and then Commanding Officer deploying twice, the first to Misawa and Okinawa, Japan and the second to Diego Garcia, Bahrain and Misrah, Oman. His next assignments were as Executive Assistant to Commander, U.S. Pacific Command, and then Commander of Patrol and Reconnaissance Wing 2. Following major command, he attended National War College before serving as Executive Assistant to the Chief of Naval Operations, where he selected for flag rank.

While serving as Commander, Patrol and Reconnaissance Group and Director, Air Warfare in OPNAV, Admiral Moran shepherded the P-8A Poseidon and MQ-4C Triton through critical elements of program approval, testing, and acceptance. His leadership and mentorship of many MPRA leaders, requirements officers, and program managers resulted in the unequivocal success of the P-8A Poseidon, variants of which are now in service with U.S. and Allied squadron across the globe. His next assignment was as the 57th Chief of Naval Personnel, where he set the Navy on a transformative path to modernize recruiting, training, education, retention, and leader development, now called "Sailor 2025".



He concluded a distinguished 38-year naval career serving as the 39<sup>th</sup> Vice Chief of Naval Operations. As the second highest ranking officer in our Navy, he played a pivotal role in every major budget and operational decision for the Navy and Joint Force including formulating and implementing the strategy, plans, and policies to support global US security objectives. At his retirement, he reflected on the incredible friendships made in uniform, his most rewarding tours leading men and women on global deployments, teaching pilots how to operate and fight the mighty Orion, and the love and support of an amazing Navy family.

### Captain Frank Bryant United States Navy

CAPT Bryant was born in San Diego, CA, attended the University of Miami and earned his commission at Aviation Officer Candidate School (AOCS) in 1972. During his first two tours at VP-24 and CPW-11, he developed a true passion for flying and fighting the P-3C and pushed others to do the same. After serving on CARGRU SIX, he reported to VP-45 as a department head, working as Training and Operations Officer. Following a tour as Requirements Officer for the community, he returned to Jacksonville as Executive Officer of VP-30, where he was personally responsible for the significant improvement in pilot retention that facilitated continued service of many future community leaders.

Selected for squadron command, he reported to VP-5, serving during the end of the Cold War and leading deployments to Bermuda and Rota, Spain. Following a successful command tour, he reported to Commander, Patrol Wings Atlantic as Operations Officer and subsequently to CTF-67 as Chief of Staff. It was during these tours, as the active-duty VP footprint was reduced from 24 squadrons to 12, that he was instrumental in the development and integration of the community's overland support and armed surveillance missions. While at CTF-67 during the Bosnian War, he noted the lack of real time imagery intelligence being provided to support the commanders' decision cycle. He personally took then-CINCSOUTH Admiral Boorda and NATO commander LGEN Ashey on a demonstration flight highlighting our potential overland imagery capability. Due in large part to this flight, the community soon found itself providing not only daily imagery intelligence, but also armed anti-surface surveillance flights carrying Maverick missiles – missions which persisted for the duration of the conflict. All this led directly to the funding, development, and integration of the Anti-Surface Warfare Improvement Program (AIP) which highlighted the community's relevance in a shifting strategic landscape and stabilized the force.

Selected for major command, he served as Commodore of Patrol Wing ELEVEN, where he emphasized and reinforced that our primary and most critical mission set was Anti-Submarine Warfare, ensuring this vital capability was not allowed to atrophy while simultaneously continuing to improve our intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance capability. His last tour was as Chief of Staff to Commander, Patrol Wings Pacific, during which his leadership and foresight facilitated the community's first overland strike mission. Serving in community positions for 23 of his 27 years of service, CAPT Bryant was critical in guiding our community through the end of the Cold War and shaping our future in P-8A, MQ-4C and beyond.
