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
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

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

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## **VP-10 Hosts Columbian Navy Crew**

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – Patrol Squadron (VP) 10 participated in a bi-lateral submarine exercise in the waters off the coast of Florida with the Columbian Navy. The Diesel Electric Submarine Initiative (DESI) program, a U.S. Navy partnership with South American countries, supports their diesel-electric submarine operations and fleet readiness events in operating areas off the U.S. coast.

The exercise provided opportunities to further the interoperability in Anti-Submarine Warfare (ASW) between the two navies. This exercise involved the Columbian submarine ARC Pijao (SS 28) along with the U.S. Maritime Patrol and Reconnaissance Aircraft, P-8A Poseidon. Through multiple flights, VP-10 was able to conduct ASW training and increase partner nation operational readiness.

After completion of the exercise, crew members from the ARC Pijao submarine were able to join VP- 10 on a P-8A flight to get a thrill of the dynamic flying conducted by the U.S. Navy.

"It was a great experience getting to know the crew of the ARC Pijao while demonstrating the flying capabilities of the P-8A," said LT Ethan White, VP-10 aircraft commander.

The VP-10 "Red Lancers" are based in Jacksonville, Florida. The squadron has recently returned from a successful six-month rotational deployment to the U.S. Seventh Fleet Area of Responsibility, operating from Kadena Air Base in Okinawa, Japan. VP-10 excelled at conducting a multitude of mission sets within the U.S. Seventh Fleet area of operation, and the squadron is preparing for another deployment in Spring of 2024.

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# VP-16 Concludes 22nd Iteration of Southeast Asia Cooperation and Training with the Philippines

Mactan, Philippines – The "War Eagles" of Patrol Squadron (VP) 16 completed exercise Southeast Asia Cooperation and Training 2023 (SEACAT 23) in Mactan, Philippines, Aug. 27, 2023.

SEACAT 23 is an exercise designed to train U.S. and regional partners for 'real world, real time' engagement and enhance their ability to communicate, coordinate and counter non-traditional maritime threats.

The War Eagles participated in three flights, providing maritime domain awareness. These flights provided situational awareness to exercise participants, and enabled the visit board search and seizure teams to execute their missions safely.

The visit strengthened the bond between the U.S. and the Philippines and enhanced the interoperability between the two navies.

"SEACAT was a memorable event that left a lasting impression on all participants involved, fostering goodwill and a sense of unity between the visiting Sailors and the gracious hosts of Mactan," said Lt. Michael Palaski, a pilot in VP-16. "Multilateral exercises such as this one allows for the exchange of expertise and best practices to and from the U.S. and its partners in the region."

One of the primary missions of the P-8A Poseidon is conducting maritime patrols and reconnaissance. With its extended range and endurance, the Poseidon can cover vast stretches of ocean, monitoring maritime traffic, detecting and tracking potential threats, and conducting search and rescue missions. Its advanced radar and sensor suite, combined with its ability to operate in various environmental conditions, enable it to excel in this role.

P-8A squadrons, like VP-16, conduct regular patrols, providing real-time intelligence, and aid in the surveillance of maritime activities, in order to deter illegal activities such as piracy, smuggling, and territorial violations.

"Working with partner nations and allies from all over Southeast Asia during SEACAT was an incredibly rewarding experience," said Lt. Zach Freels of VP-16. "All entities involved operated with efficiency and determination. We anticipate that exercises like these lead to increased coordination and synchrony of information, surveillance and reconnaissance assets, further allowing these nations to police their exclusive economic zones and maintain a free and open Indo-Pacific."

## VP-26 Concludes Maritime Patrol and Reconnaissance Training with India

INS RAJALI, India – The "Tridents" of Patrol Squadron (VP) 26 completed a week-long combined anti-submarine warfare (ASW) subject matter expert exchange with the "Albatross" of Indian Naval Air Squadron (INAS) 312 at India Naval Air Station Rajali, Tamil Nadu India, Aug. 28, 2023.

The subject matter expert exchange focused on improving interoperability between the two navies' maritime patrol and reconnaissance forces. It included training on ASW and information sharing on specific maritime-challenges in the Indian Ocean. One VP 26 P-8A Poseidon aircraft and one INAS 312 P-8I Poseidon aircraft participated in the exchange. INAS 312 is one of two Indian Navy squadrons operating the P-8I Poseidon.

"This is a great opportunity to strengthen our partnership with India and improve our ability to work together to protect the maritime commons," said Lt. Ryan Speir, VP-26's detachment officer in charge. "The P-8A is a highly capable aircraft which plays a vital role in ASW operations, and this professional exchange will ensure that we are able to effectively use this asset in a combined environment."

The two squadrons participated in flying and non-flying activities, which included discussions on operational planning, maintenance training and logistical support. VP-26 and INAS 312 also coordinated flying events with Indian Navy surface ships.

The exchange is the latest in a series of interactions between the U.S. and Indian navies, reflecting their shared commitment to building interoperability and collaborating in support of maritime security in the Indo-Pacific region.

The P-8A is a long-range, multi-mission maritime patrol aircraft that is capable of conducting ASW, anti-surface warfare, search and rescue, and intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance missions. The P-8I, the Indian variant of the P-8A, is equipped with additional sensors and weapons that are tailored to the Indian Navy's requirements.

The VP-26 "Tridents" are based in Jacksonville, Fla., and are currently forward deployed to Misawa Air Base, Japan. The squadron conducts maritime patrol and reconnaissance as part of a rotational deployment to the U.S. 7th Fleet area of operations.

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## **VP-8 Flies to NAS Corpus Christi, Shows off P-8A to Flight School Students**

Corpus Christi, Texas— Sailors assigned to Patrol Squadron (VP) 8 flew a P-8A Poseidon aircraft from NAS Jacksonville to NAS Corpus Christi to showcase the Fleet's latest maritime patrol and reconnaissance platform to flight school students September 19, 2023.

The line to board and learn about the P-8A stretched back over 20 yards under the cloudless Texas sun and included the Fleet's newest flight school students as well as the top brass of NAS Corpus Christi.

"Opportunities such as these are incredibly important for flight students," said Cmdr. Joe Reardon, commanding officer of Training Squadron (VT) 35. "having the P-8 static display is extremely beneficial because it allows the students to see the aircraft up close, interact with the crew, and potentially visualize their future."

The coordination for the static display was handled by Lt. Louis Rondinella, a current pilot assigned to VP-8 and Lt. John Lansing, a prior VP-8 pilot and current Training Squadron (VT) 31 instructor.

"Many students don't know about maritime patrol," said Lansing. "Today's objective was to introduce as many flight students as possible to maritime patrol and reconnaissance forces and raise awareness to the greatness of this great platform."

With only weeks away until a class of student pilots choose their respective platforms, the P-8A static display helped some make a more informed decision.

"Initially, most students want to fly jets," said Ens. Joseph Hammer, a flight student assigned to Training Squadron (VT) 28. "After seeing the crew unity onboard the P-8 where every member is involved with the mission, that kind of resonates with me more solo flying platforms."

VP-8 was commissioned as VP-201 in September 1942 in Norfolk, Virginia. During World War II, flying the sea-based PBM Mariner aircraft. In June 1947, the squadron transitioned to the landbased P-2V Neptune aircraft. The squadron was renamed to VP-8 in September 1948, and in October 1962, VP-8 became the first operational P-3 Orion squadron in the U.S. Navy.

Following the squadron's 37th P-3 Orion deployment, VP-8 transitioned to the P-8A Poseidon in 2015. VP-8 is currently executing its fleet readiness training plan in preparation for an upcoming deployment.



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


